

TRAVEL ENTRY REQUIREMENT IN KENYA

- *All passengers arriving in Kenya must have an approved e-visa . Visas are no longer issued on arrival in Kenya. The e-visa takes a minimum of 2 working days to be approved. We advise you apply a month in advance if possible.*
- *From 1st January 2021, all passengers from countries that require a visa to enter Kenya, will need to apply for an e-visa in advance. For more information on this visit www.evisa.go.ke Visas cost US \$50 / €40 / £30 and are valid for 3 months from the date of entry.*
- *A return ticket must be shown and your passport must be valid for 6 months after your stay. Only a few small Commonwealth countries are exempt from visas. All other nationalities requiring a visa (including European Union, British, Australians and US citizens) are also advised to have at least three blank pages available in their passport on arrival.*
- *Travelers below the age of twelve (12) years shall be exempt from the requirements of a vaccination certificate or PCR test. All travelers above the age of 12 years arriving in Kenya will be required to show proof of either COVID-19 vaccination OR a negative PCR test result conducted not more than 72 hours before departure. The requirement for travelers to upload Certificates to Panabios has been removed and hard/soft copies of the same are now accepted.*
- *Any traveler above the age of twelve (12) arriving at any point of entry with no proof of vaccination or PCR test or those with flu-like symptoms shall be subjected to a rapid antigen test at their own cost of 30 USD. Any person who tests positive on antigen RDT will be subjected to entry PCR test at their own further cost of 50 USD and self-isolate as per the Ministry of Health's guidance on isolation.*
- *Any traveler arriving at any port of entry into Kenya with flu-like symptoms will be required to fill the passenger locator form on the https://ears.health.go.ke/airline_registration/ a 'jitenge' platform International Travelers Health Surveillance Form and to undergo rapid antigen test at own cost regardless of age or vaccination status. If positive on antigen test they will be required to undergo a COVID-19 PCR test own cost.*

HEALTH

If you are planning to travel to East Africa, you should consult your Medical Practitioner before travel.

- ***IMMUNIZATIONS AND VACCINATIONS:*** *No vaccinations are mandatory for entry into Kenya, however certain inoculations and malaria tablets are recommended and you should consult your medical practitioner at least 6 weeks before you travel. - ***YELLOW FEVER VACCINATION*** *(supported by a certificate) are required for travel if you are traveling from/between a Yellow Fever endemic country/ies. We strongly recommend seeking information from Yellow Fever a health authority in your country of residence well before your travel dates.*

DEPARTURE FROM KENYA:

- *Passengers departing Kenya will be required to abide by the particular travel, health and COVID-19 related requirements of the destination country.*

- *Testing may be considered at the discretion of any of the airlines departing from in Kenya.*
- *There are a number of COVID-19 testing facilities throughout the country both in Nairobi and Safari areas.*
